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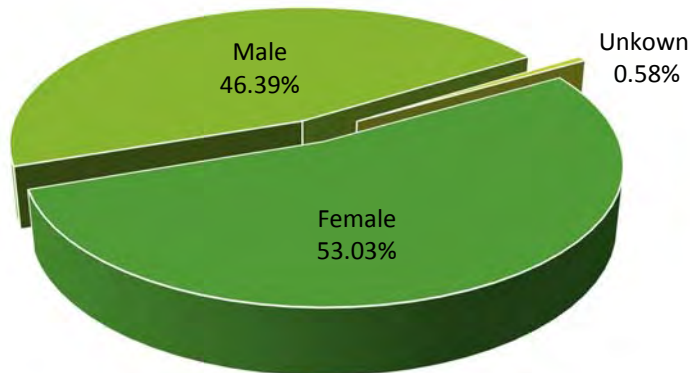

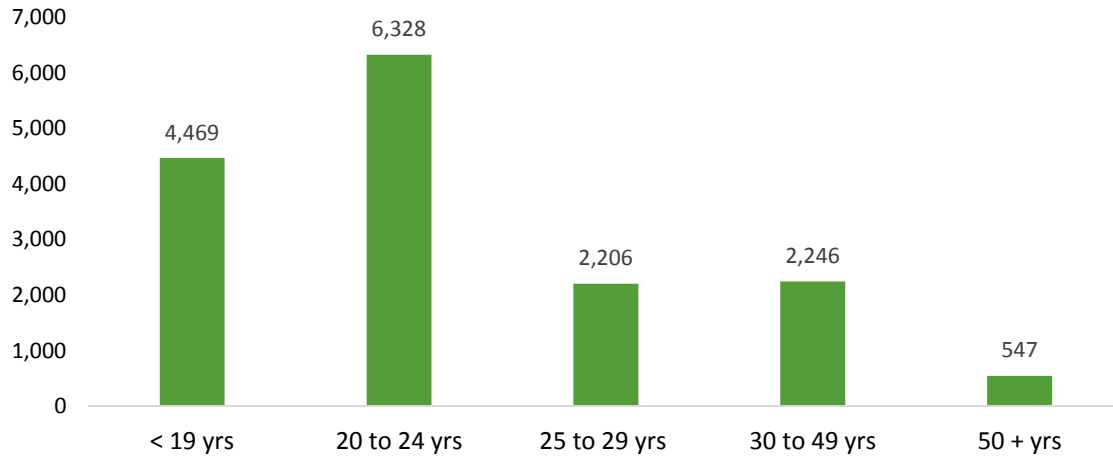

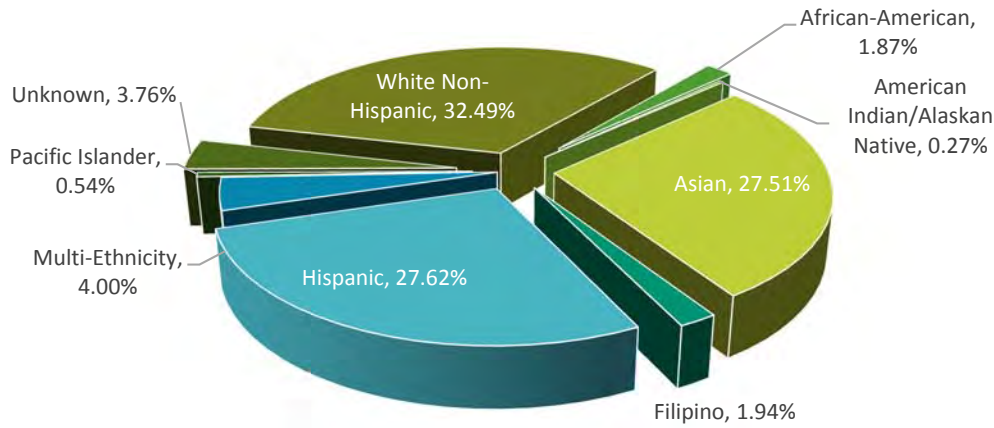

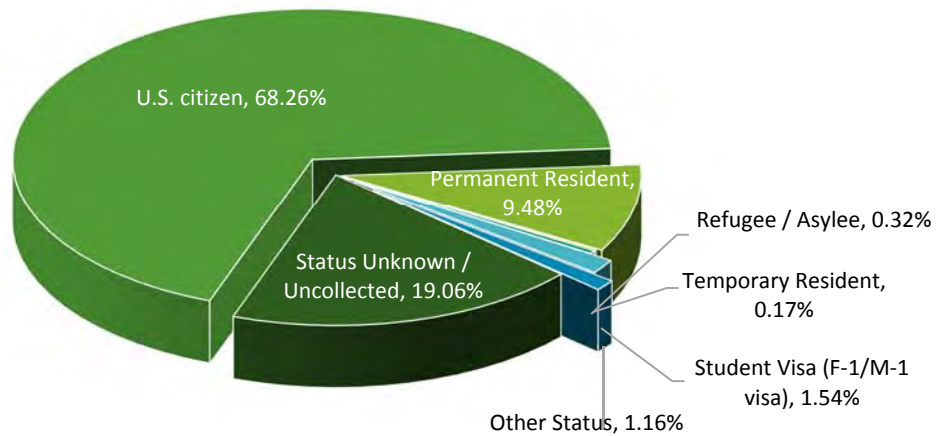
### Students by Race/Ethnicity 2012-2013

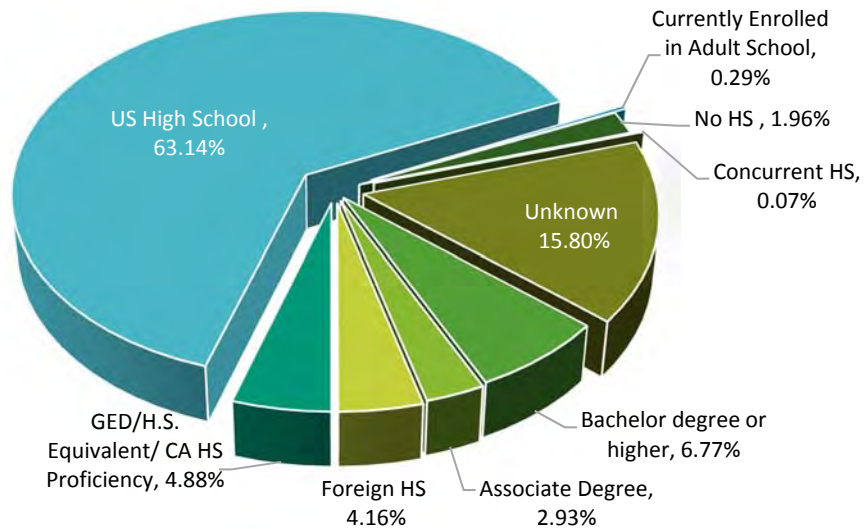
### Fall 2012 Student Citizenship Status

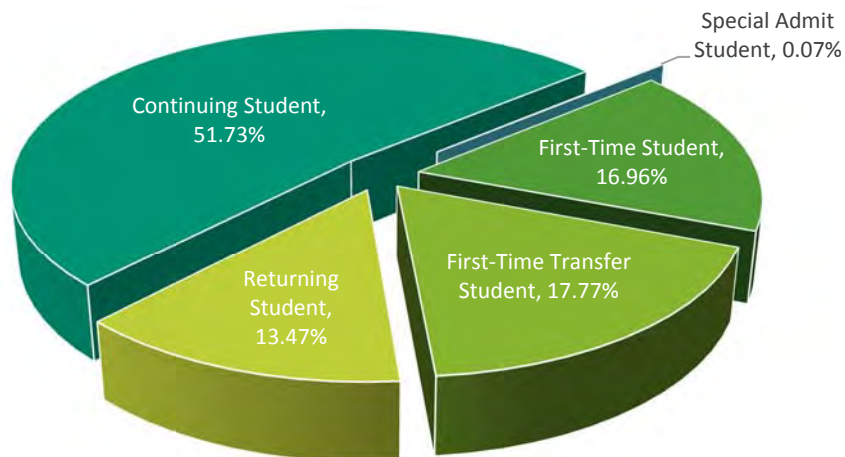
### Fall 2012 Students by Educational Background

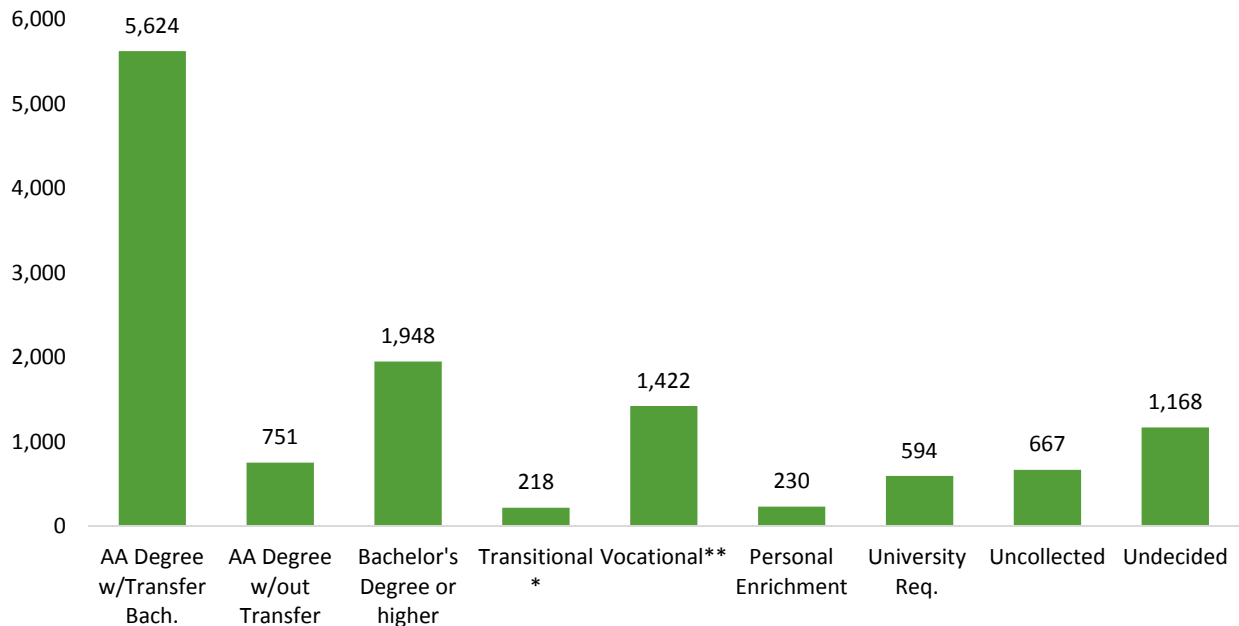

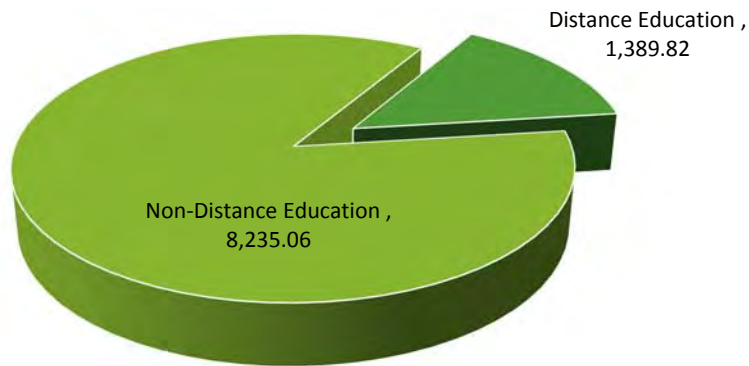

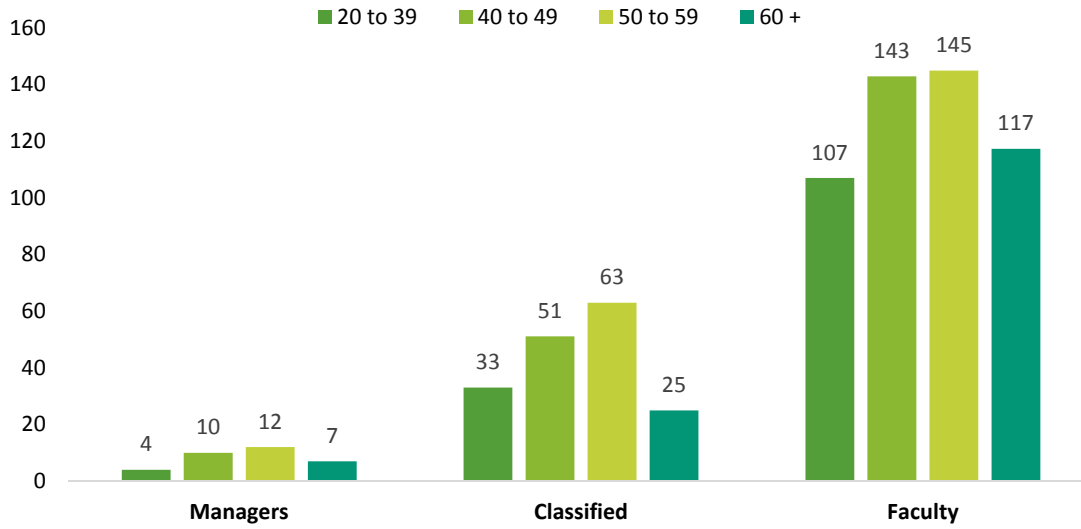

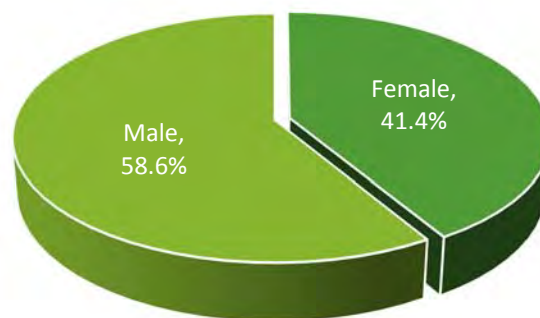
**Managers by Gender**

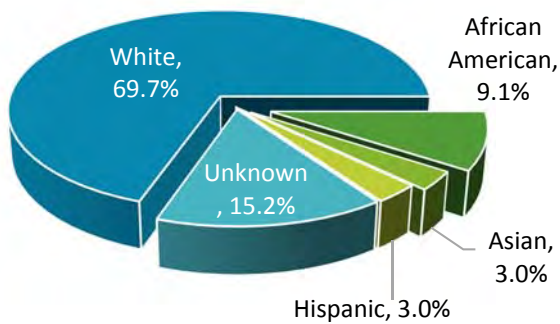

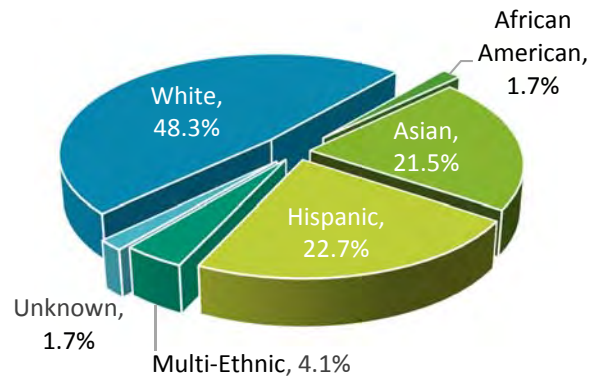
