COLL G090	cSLO 7	Spring 2016	100% of the students assessed were able to identify their preferred learning style.
COLL G100	cSLO 1	Fall 2015	The survey results indicated that 70.4% of students reported that they increased their understanding at a high level, and an additional 27.5% indicated they increased their understanding at a medium level. This is a total of 97.9% for these two levels.
COLL G100	cSLO 1	Fall 2017	The survey results indicated that 77.4% (72 out of 93) developed the highest levels (Levels 5 and 6) of competency in understanding what is expected of them as a college student. Another 21% indicated they had an above average (Level 4) of competency. Only 2% of the students indicated an average to less than poor understanding of what is expected of them to be a successful college student. These are excellent results and we hope to get the highest levels above 80% in future assessments.
COLL G100	cSLO 2	Spring 2016	The survey results indicated that 78% of the students developed the highest levels (#5 and #6) of student success in this Student Learning Outcome (SLO). Another 14% indicated an above average (Level #4) of student success. This is the first time this SLO has been assessed. The students are learning to realistically assess their present skills and being able to develop a plan to better themselves in college and their careers. We would like to see the highest results be above the 80% level in the future.
COLL G100	cSLO 4	Fall 2016	The survey results indicate that 78.4% (91 out of 116) of the students successfully completed this SLO.Furthermore another 13% felt they had scored above average competency in this area. These are very good results as many students during the fall semester are first-time freshmen. They struggle with this area as they do not feel confident in their speaking and oral presentation abilities.
COLL G100	cSLO 4	Spring 2018	The survey results indicated that 73% of the students felt they had developed the highest level of competency regarding communication techniques. This is a slight drop from the previous assessment. But another 20% of the students did indicate they had developed a level of above-average regarding their communication techniques. The total above average is strong (93%), but the faculty would like a higher percentage in the highest levels (Levels 5 and 6) of the survey.
COLL G100	cSLO 5	Spring 2017	The survey results indicate that 65% of the students developed the highest level of competency in being able to use the Library resources to locate and evaluate information. Another 27% of the students indicated an above-average level of competency. We consider these results as low. The online College 100 classes get a lower level of instruction in this area compared to the traditional classes. The librarians are working on an online version of their presentations and how to easily search for materials. We have also found a need to have instruction on what is the difference between good verses bad research materials. Students

			developed a high level of skills in Blackboard to locate, organize and complete
			assignments. An additional 22.2% indicated they increased their skills at a
			medium level.No students reported at the low or no increase levels.

			level of competency using Canvas after the completion of this course. A total of
			25% attained an above-average level of competency. In sum, 100% of the
			students completed the survey indicated achieving a high level of competency
			in navigating Canvas, along with locating, organizing, and completing
			assignments. The SLO identified has been met successfully.

			level of competency using Canvas after the completion of the course. However,
			only three students completed and submitted a survey. The sample size is very
			small, thus, it is difficult to make any assumptions that all the students in the

			92.85% of the students responded with a ranking of above average

			contacted the instructor and the response time falling between 24 hours to 1-2
			days.

COLL G090	cSLO 7	Spring 2016	College 090 was developed to help students whose study skills are below the entry level for College 100. It is important for students to be aware of their preferred learning styles as they learned different strategies for note-taking, test-taking, etc. during this semester. When I teach this class again, I will have the students complete another Learning Styles Inventory at the end of the semester and discuss how their preferences may have changed.
COLL G100	cSLO 1	Fall 2015	While this is the first time this SLO is being reported, each semester the department gathers this data. The fall semester result shows a three percentage point in increase in students reporting a high level of understanding of the culture of postsecondary education. The two levels find a very high level of understanding from this class. As a department we will focus on another SLO in the spring.
COLL G100	cSLO 1	Fall 2017	The results were very encouraging. With the students enrollment in other classes, they are indicating that College 100 is providing them a strong foundation of skills to be a successful students. Many of the skills developed in College 100 are being used

			students at the highest levels in a future assessment. We are also going to look at a
			better assessment tool for this SLO. There are programs, such as the LASSI, that are
			better at self assessment and can provide the students better information regarding
			their skills and where they need to focus. These programs also have post-
			assessment data to have a better understanding of how much the students learned
			during the semester. We will continue to assess this SLO in the future.
COLL G100	cSLO 4	Fall 2016	The students have been very successful in this SLO. We hope to continue to move
			forward and would like to see the highest levels be above 80% in the next
			assessment. Many of our faculty focus on instruction in this area as they realize the
			more participation by students in the class, the higher the confidence level, and
			resulting in increased skills in their speaking and presentation abilities.
COLL G100	cSLO 4	Spring 2018	While the total percentage of students in the above average of higher levels, there
			was a slight decline in the number of students at the highest levels. The faculty are
			interested in focusing on this to discover if this is a blip or a trend in the data and
			then determining an action plan.
COLL G100	cSLO 5	Spring 2017	The librarians are putting into place a librarian focused on online course instruction
			and materials. This will significantly improve instruction and the resources available
			for online College 100 students. Faculty are also focusing more on instructing
			students on the use of more academic resources. Students are knowledgeable
			about Google searches but do not know the difference between Google searches and more academic resource searches.

COLL G151	CSLO 2	Fall 2015	The assessment provides additional evidence that College G151 students are meeting the identified SLO at a very high level. One thing to note, however, the
			data set was very limited. While this data is studied every semester, this is the first
			time this information is reported in an SLO Assessment Form. We will continue to
			monitor this SLO in the future. There will be no changes in the course as the
			assessment indicates students have been able to achieve the identified SLO.
COLL G151	cSLO 2	Fall 2016	All College G151 students who were assessed are meeting the identified SLO at the
0011 0101			higher levels. the data is surprising since this was the first semester that College
			G151 was taught using Canvas instead of Blackboard. It is possible that the
			transition to a new Learning Management System has made the course pedagogy
			easier to understand from a student perspective. Although 75% of the students
			have taken an online course prior to this course, it is possible that for most students,
			this was their first experience with Canvas. I would like to assess this student
			learning outcome again in the future.
COLL G151	cSLO 2	Spring 2017	Due to the very small sample size, it is difficult to make assumptions based on the
			limited data. This raises an important issue moving forward. As a result of the low
			return rate of completion, I will need to rethink how to make the survey more
			accessible in Canvas. In the previous fall semester, I had a larger submission rate,
			but in spring it was much lower. I will need to develop a consistent strategy in
			ensuring a higher return rate. Moreover, I would like to assess this student learning
			outcome again in the future.
COLL G151	cSLO 2	Fall 2017	When previously assessed this SLO, the sample size was low. This time, the sample
			size has increased dramatically, giving me a deeper understanding of whether
			students are fulfilling the SLO standard or not. Overall, I am thrilled to see that 78%
			of the students feel that they have reached the highest level of competency using
			Canvas while an additional 14% of the students ranking themselves in the above
			average category. Thus, 92@ of the students achieved the standard. One area of

			improvement is that I would like to see a higher percentage of students to be in the highest category rating. Although 78% is great, I like to assess this standard again to see if I can boost this number.
COLL G151	cSLO 4	Spring 2018	The assessment, unfortunately, had a very small sample size. A total of 4 students answered the survey out of 15. As a result of the small sample size, it is difficult to make assumptions based on the limited responses. However, it is revealing that all students assessed had taken a prior online course. Thus, it indicates that students had a preexisting understanding of how to get help if a technical issue were to arise in Canvas. In the future, I might revise my course syllabus to include the Online Help Desk number under Contact Information. In addition, I will need to distribute the survey differently to ensure a higher participation rate.
