5.1: Select one course in US History, Western Civilizations, and World History

5.2: Electives: Select ONE additional course from US History, Western Civilizations, or any other history courses.

UC IRVINE: BA History. Minimum 2.7 GPA / 3.4 for TAG.

6.1: Select one course & up to four additional history courses

6.2: All students must complete a "Humanities Core"

Option 1: HUMAN 1A + 1AS + 1B + 1BS + 1C + 1CS at UCI

Option 2: (a) one writing course from ENGL G100 or ENGL G110; (b) One additional literature course selected from ENGL G112, G150, G155, G160, G161, G270, G275; (c) one History course; and (d) one Philosophy course from: PHIL G100, G102, G120, PHIL G150/PSCI G150.

6.3: Students must complete any language course at G285-Level

7.1: Select two additional History courses

UC RIVERSIDE: BA History. Option in Administrative Studies. Minimum 2.4 GPA.

8.1: Complete two lower division History courses. One course at any CCC. One course must be in world history (HIST G161 or G162).

8.2: If selecting a concentration in US History, complete HIST G170 and G175 (or AP score of 3)

8.3: For Administrative Studies, add BUS G100, ACCTG G101, CS G130, & MATH G160 (or AP score of 4)

UC SAN DIEGO: Impacted Major. BA History. Minimum 2.4 GPA.
